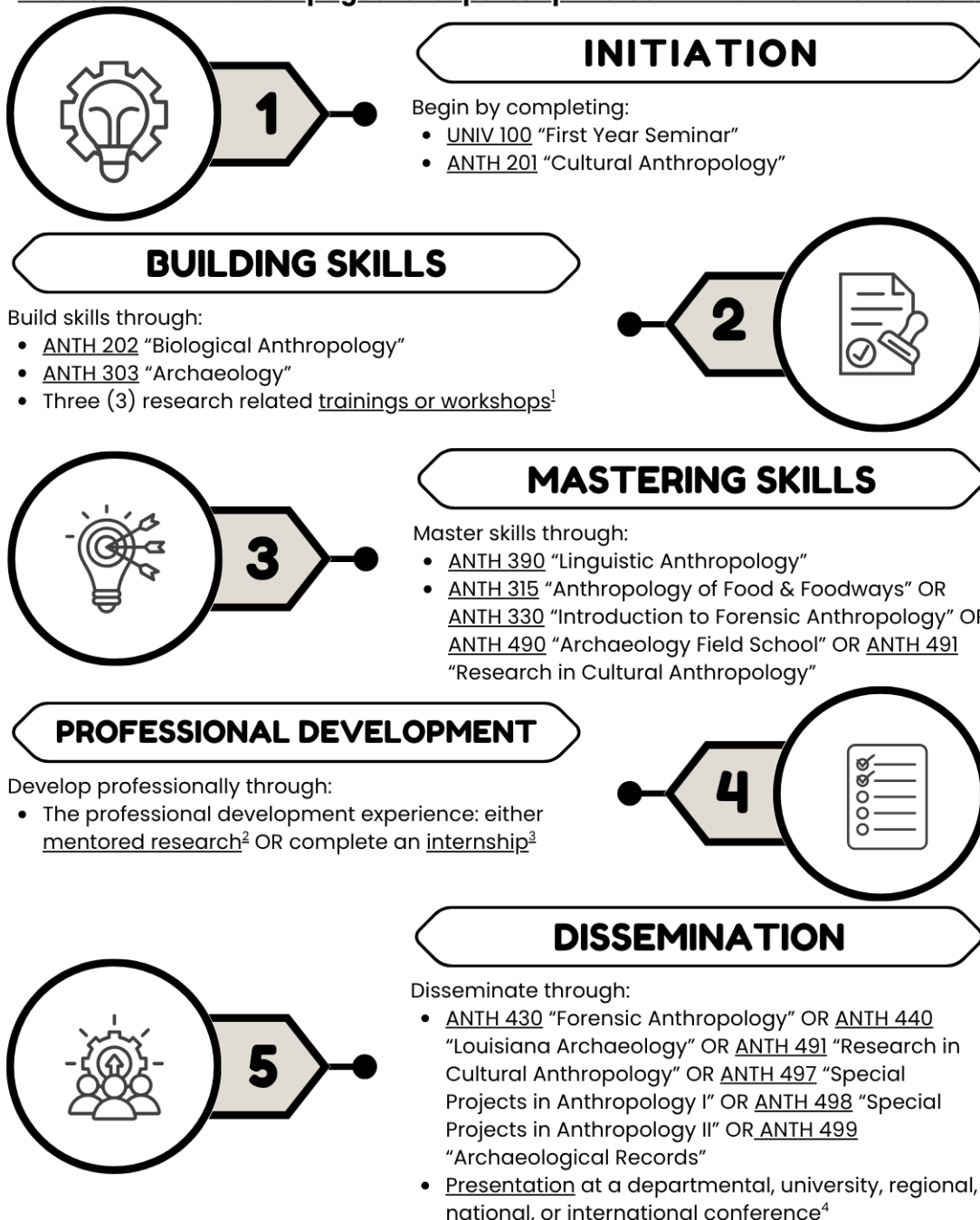


ASRE PATHWAY OF DISTINCTION IN ANTHROPOLOGY

* ASRE-approved courses only. Students who have earned credits for a course that is not ASRE approved may petition to substitute that course with a 300 or 400 level course identified as providing research skill. The SCRCS Advance office will review the petition for approval. Approved substitutions are only for the purpose of completing an Advance Pathway and are not approved as substitution for the degree.

¹Approved workshops can include, but are not limited to SCRCS, library, or university workshops. SCRCS Advance Workshops can be found on the UL Lafayette SCRCS website. 1 in person SCRCS workshop is equivalent to 2 virtual SCRCS workshops. Other workshops focused on research skills are possible by approval from the Anthropology department including workshops from professional organizations such as the American Anthropological Association.

²Mentored research: students should not attempt these research endeavors alone and should work under the supervision of an ANTH faculty member. Mentored research includes, but is not limited to, volunteer, scholarship, or paid from grants under the direct supervision of an ANTH faculty member and can receive credit as ANTH 497 and/or ANTH 498.

³Internship may be internal or external to UL Lafayette. ANTH 497 or 498 would count.

⁴Examples include, but are not limited to: Louisiana Archaeological Society, American Anthropological Association, Southern Anthropological Society, and Society for Applied Anthropology

⁵Examples include, but are not limited to: Louisiana Archaeological Society, American Anthropological Association, Southern Anthropological Society, Society for Applied Anthropology. Must also be a different conference than Presentation requirement.

⁶Must be peer-reviewed outlet. (Examples include, but are not limited to: American Anthropologist, Journal of Linguistic Anthropology, Human Organization, Southeastern Archaeology, Louisiana Archaeology, American Antiquity, American Anthropologist, American Journal of Biological Anthropology, Medical Anthropology Quarterly, Journal of Forensic Science).
