13. Dissemination

Presentation at a regional, national, or international conference.

- Examples include, but are not limited to: Louisiana Archaeological Society, American Anthropological Association, Southern Anthropological Society, Society for Applied Anthropology. Must also be a different conference than Presentation requirement.

**OR**

Honor Thesis

**OR**

Publication submission (author or co-author)

- Must be peer-reviewed outlet. (Examples include, but are not limited to: American Anthropologist, Journal of Linguistic Anthropology, Human Organization, Southeastern Archaeology, Louisiana Archaeology, American Antiquity, American Anthropologist, American Journal of Biological Anthropology, Medical Anthropology Quarterly, Journal of Forensic Science).
