SCRCS Advance Workshops can be found on the UL Lafayette SCRCS website. 1 in person SCRCS workshop is equivalent to 2 virtual SCRCS workshops, thus, 2 virtual workshops would be needed to count for 1 workshop/training experience. Other workshops/trainings focused on research skills are possible by approval from the Criminal Justice Department. Other trainings that could count include CITI training or others as specified by the Criminal Justice Department.
