* ASRE-approved courses only. Students who have earned credits for a course that is not ASRE approved may petition to substitute that course with a 300 or 400 level course identified by the Economics and Finance department. The SCRCS Advance office will review the petition for approval. Approved substitutions are only for the purpose of completing an Advance Pathway and are not approved as substitution for the degree.

¹Approved workshops can include, but are not limited to SCRCS, library, or university workshops. SCRCS Advance Workshops can be found on the UL Lafayette SCRCS website. 1 in person SCRCS workshop is equivalent to 2 virtual SCRCS workshops. Other workshops focused on research skills are possible by approval from the Economics and Finance department.

²Mentored research includes but is not limited to volunteer, scholarship, paid from grants, MUREs (mentored undergraduate research experience), SUREs (summer undergraduate research experiences) and approved ECON 497. The Economics Undergraduate Research committee will evaluate the mentored research that is submitted by the student and input from their mentor.

³Internship may be internal or external to UL Lafayette. ECON 499 would count.

⁴Participation is required. Departmental, university, regional, national, or international competitions will count.

⁵Presentation may be poster or oral presentation.

⁶Presentation may be poster or oral presentation. Conference must be different from Presentation requirement.
